SMALL GRANTS FROM £2,000 TO £20,000

SMALL GRANTS CHAMPIONING SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING AND MATHS ACROSS THE WEST MIDLANDS

CRITERIA

- > Proposed activity must be based in the geographical area of the West Midlands Region of the United Kingdom.
- Proposed activity must demonstrate tangible links to either one or more of the disciplines of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM).
- > Proposed activity must align with the Millennium Point Charitable objectives around the advancement of learning and education.
- > Have a legacy beyond the life of the project.
- > Provide a service or address a relevant need which is otherwise not supported.
- > Demonstrate evidence of starting within 12-months of funds being received with clear milestones and end date within a maximum of 2 years.
- > Demonstrate measurable outcomes based on key performance indicators, metrics and impact against the project mission statement.
- > Funding can be used for start-up projects, to extend or develop an existing project or to purchase equipment or resources.

Existing projects applying for funding must significantly adapt or increase the lifespan of activities delivered previously. This development must be based on learnings, or expand the project to engage a new community, group or demographic.

New initiatives must provide research and feasibility case studies as part of the proposal.

Research projects applying must be centered around public benefit rather than commercial gains.

If the Millennium Point Charitable Trust is not the sole funder of the project, then the applicant must detail how our contribution will impact the project.

- × Organisations outside the UK
- Organisations on behalf of another organisation
