
MAKING AN IMPACT IN EASTSIDE AND A DIFFERENCE TO BIRMINGHAM

AN ICONIC DESTINATION FOR BUSINESS, LEARNING AND DISCOVERY

Multi-functional buildings require a lot of juggling of often competing priorities — especially when some of those need to blend private sector thinking with a philanthropic ethos.

Over the last 12 months, the commercial property company has built its capacity in order to become an iconic destination in the heart of a regenerated area, and ensured that it has a programme in place to respond to the needs of its tenants and users.

The company's priority is to ensure that our partners, tenants and customers get the best from their surroundings in Millennium Point. We are now 99% occupied, which means we can not only generate a healthy surplus to enable Millennium Point Trust to do more, but also invest in the efficiency, performance and future of the estate.

THE REGION'S GATEWAY OF OPPORTUNITY

Over the last 12 months we have developed a solid strategy for the trust, the property company and the building as we move forward continuing to thrive as a fundamental component in Birmingham's growing Knowledge Quarter. This comes at a time where we have seen a growth in stature, the culmination of a lot of hard work and significant changes to the way we operate – delivering our best ever financial performance.

GROWTH

The drive to convert underutilised space has intensified over the year and has been a cornerstone of our growth strategy. We sublet the former cinema auditorium to Birmingham City University which transformed an unprofitable area into a valued teaching space and in February, welcomed a leading independent bistro into a vacated café unit.

The recent deal with Birmingham City University in relation to land owned by Millennium Point towards the north side of our estate complemented this intensification, with this area becoming the new home to the flagship and highly regarded Birmingham Conservatoire (scheduled for completion and opening in 2017).

We are now 99% occupied as a building. This allows the trust to continue to create opportunities for local people, forge new partnerships and deliver exciting projects.

ENHANCEMENT

Ensuring that we continue to be the best custodians of this iconic landmark, meet our commitments as a landlord and guarantee that the building continues to be a public venue, are central to how we run the building. We have developed a ten year estates strategy to further support this.

During 2015/2016, we carried out two significant projects to improve the building for our tenants and the overall visitor experience. We replaced all three chillers and flushed associated pipework to maintain a cool flow of air throughout and refurbished both of our main atrium lifts.

Redevelopment work began throughout existing public areas within the Atrium, focusing on enhancing our public spaces to generate new opportunities and reach new markets and audiences

ENGAGEMENT

Millennium Point is a public building and public buildings should thrive with life and energy. Building on the launch of our new brand two years ago, we now regularly host a diverse range of activities — from large scale public events to performances, exhibitions and fairs.

Our events and programming business is experiencing significant growth, with an ever-



expanding portfolio of regional and national brands and organisations choosing us as a venue. 2015 was our most successful year to date, with a record breaking amount of events taking place as well as our highest visitor numbers.

The work of the trust was further enhanced by grants to two of our leading partners; Birmingham City University and Thinktank – the city's science museum.

We also launched the Young Innovator Prize, which saw us sponsor an ambitious young person through an undergraduate degree at Birmingham City University in a science, technology or engineering related subject.

We believe that Millennium Point is a catalyst to enriching local lives through technology, science and arts. As Chair of the Eastside Forum, I work with a number

of other organisations and institutions to collaborate ideas and discover ways we can enhance the prospects of Eastside for future generations.


THE FUTURE


